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STATEWIDE INFORMATION SYSTEM 2012/2013

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PROJECT OVERVIEW

Authority and Objectives

The Statewide Information System (SIS) implements the provisions of several Arkansas General Assembly enactments which mandate that the Arkansas Department of Education (ADE) make extensive use of information technology at the state and local levels to provide accurate and timely information to policy makers and to reduce the state reporting burden. Ark. Code Annotated {6-11-124 (Repl. 1993) requires the implementation of a statewide computer network that will connect all school systems and the ADE. Ark. Code Annotated {6-15-807 directs the ADE to implement automated data systems for financial and education reporting which develop methods for longitudinal studies for school improvement and reduce the number of reports required to be submitted to the ADE. Ark. Code Annotated {6-11-125} directs the ADE to reduce the amount of paperwork submitted by school districts by utilizing to the fullest extent possible the information technology network beginning no later than July 1, 1998.

The objectives of the SIS are to:

- A. Ensure that every school district has access to comparable administrative computing systems and services with which to meet all local and state requirements.
- B. Promote increased compatibility of the administrative records and data maintained by each district office and school site.
- C. Reduce the paperwork and reporting burden of school sites and district offices.
- D. Increase the accuracy and timeliness of data submitted by school districts to the ADE for state and federal reporting, program analysis, and evaluation.
- E. Result in the availability at the state level of a comprehensive and integrated database of information about students, programs, district personnel, and finances to be utilized for planning and policy-making.

Authority and Objectives

SIS Implementation Requirements for Districts and Education Service Cooperatives

Every school district must have implemented an automated district information system meeting the following requirements:

- A. The district information system must contain a centralized system of records and data for all schools, programs, staff, finances and facilities.
- B. For local record keeping, the district information system must provide the business functions of accounts payable, general ledger, purchasing, inventory, fixed assets, personnel, and payroll. Student functions must include daily and class attendance, course scheduling, report cards and permanent records, special education, health, discipline, as well as other demographic and program information defined as necessary by the ADE.
- C. The district information system must comply with all data definitions and procedures specified by the ADE for financial accounting, personnel records, and student records. This shall include implementation of Handbook IIR2 standards for financial accounting, state student numbering procedures, common course number and title conventions, automated attendance record keeping procedures, permanent record content, and requirements for calculation of high school grade point averages.

SIS Requirements for the Arkansas Department of Education

The ADE will make available to every district all required data elements, records, and procedures for local record keeping and state reporting in a document called the SIS Handbook.

This SIS Handbook will be updated once annually to reflect all changes in requirements resulting from state or federal laws and regulations. The ADE shall make every effort to distribute the annual update as far in advance of each new fiscal year as possible. The online version (<http://apscn.org>, click on the SIS menu, then select “Statewide Information System”) is scheduled for release March 1st of every year. Hard copy versions will be distributed during the summer APSCN/ADE training sessions or upon request.

If changes to the SIS Handbook become necessary after its initial release and printing, updates will be made to the online version only. A director’s memo will be issued announcing specific changes. Hard copy issues should have changes manually written into them.

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PROJECT OVERVIEW

Confidentiality and Access Standards

The ADE shall implement the following procedures for the privacy, security, and retention of all district, student, personnel, financial data and records collected, maintained, and utilized at the state level:

A. Privacy of Records

1. Individual, personally identifiable student records collected and maintained by the ADE shall be accessible only to authorized state education officials as prescribed by the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) under 20 U.S.C. 1232G and 34 CRF Part 99.
2. The ADE shall not disclose personally identifiable individual student records to any person, institution, agency, or organization except as authorized by federal and state law and regulation. The ADE shall only use personal identifiable student information to prepare and publish aggregate reports and analysis.

B. Data Security

1. The Arkansas Department of Education (ADE) and Arkansas Public School Computer Network (APSCN) will control stringently access to data and records submitted by school districts through security conventions and procedures that are established by ADE and APSCN.
2. Appropriate computer security will be implemented to ensure that users will be granted access only to the data necessary to complete federal or state-mandated activities.

C. Records Retention

1. The ADE shall establish record retention procedures for maintaining and destroying personally identifiable district information.
2. Except as required for auditing or monitoring activities, or for the evaluation of state or federal programs, personally identifiable records shall be destroyed according to a schedule developed by the ADE.

SIS OVERVIEW

The Arkansas Department of Education (ADE) and Arkansas Public School Computer Network (APSCN) in cooperation with the Department of Information Services (DIS) has developed a state reporting process design that will allow Arkansas school districts to report their data electronically over the statewide network to the ADE.


Both ADE and APSCN approve the database structure. A relational database design has been implemented as outlined in the Record Relationships chart. Data is collected as it directly relates to one of the records outlined. When the data to be collected is not available, data screens are provided by the APSCN programming staff to collect required data (i.e. bus and facility data).

The data submissions will be transmitted in accordance with the reporting cycles outlined in the Data Submission Cycles chart (page 8-10). All unit records are cyclic and must be submitted in their entirety by their due date(s). There will be a calculated elements database created from the unit records submitted by each district. The programs that create these data elements will be used for all calculations at the APSCN and ADE, ensuring that all formulas and/or logic that derive items such as Average Daily Attendance (ADA) are the same for all parties.

APSCN provides procedural instructions, release notes and documentation for each cycle. This information is published far enough in advance of each cycle to give the user time to meet the cycle submission due date. It can be accessed by going on the Internet to the APSCN web site at <http://apscn.org> click on the SIS menu, then select "Statewide Information System." Only district personnel selected to perform state reporting coordinator duties will execute record submissions by utilizing the APSCN_GUI (Graphical User Interface) on their network-connected workstation. All reports produced for a cycle should be reviewed by appropriate district, school, food service, and counselor personnel for accuracy prior to submission to the ADE. Once the data submission is complete, each district is required by the ADE to sign and return the "Certification of Data Accuracy" form (one for each cycle) to the ADE. This form is part of the release notes provided by APSCN for each cycle.

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
RECORDS RELATIONSHIPS


